OVERVIEW

Model Laboratory School was established in 1906 on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University. Model's purpose is to educate students from K through 12th grade while providing field experiences for EKU students and demonstrating evidence-based instructional strategies. Enrollment is about 720 students for all grade levels, serviced by 86 faculty and staff professionals. As the only laboratory school remaining in the state of Kentucky, Model Lab offers a unique opportunity for interaction among college faculty, K through 12th grade faculty, and students of all ages. Model Laboratory School collaborates with EKU's College of Education and is part of EKU's Division of Engagement and Regional Stewardship.

HIGH SCHOOL FORMAT

All courses are taught on a seven day, 50 minute period for the duration of the school year. All classes meet Monday through Friday and taught at an advanced level. Advanced Placement courses are offered and Dual Credit is offered through Eastern Kentucky University.

GRADING SCALE

All courses are included in computing GPA; students are not ranked. Grading is on a letter system with numerical equivalents below. Grades are earned on an unweighted 4.0 system.

ASSESSMENTS

Model High School students participate in PSAT/NMSQT, AP, and all other testing required by the Kentucky Department of Education. Graduation rate and successful transition to post-secondary options are also in school ratings. Model Laboratory High School has consistently ranked among the top ten schools statewide on Kentucky assessments and earned a five-star rating from the Kentucky Department of Education.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students in the Class of 2020 must earn at least 26 credits to graduate.
